In addition, there will be basic exercise-in-technique assignments designed to develop dexterity in the handling of clay, specifically handbuilding methods including pinch, coil and slab, and surface treatments including underglaze and slip decoration (261), glaze, and overglaze. Participation in clay mixing is also required.* Throwing on the wheel is optional and **NOT** required except for those students enrolled in Art 261, which focuses on developing throwing skills on the wheel**. There will be two written exams as noted below.

Week 2 1/7-10	Handbuilding techniques: 1/8 coil and 1/10 slab; basic wheel throwing techniques: centering,the'cylinder' and shaping;; surface technique: underglazes; 3 sketches due for 1 st project on Thursday 1/10		
Week 3 1/14-17	Discussion and slide presentation of second project, 1/15; surface treatment: lowfire glazes on 1/15 and Cone 10 high fire glazes discussed as surface technique on 1/17; wheel throwing: plates and for 261		
Week 4 1/22-24	HOLIDAY on Monday 21 st ; Discussion and slide presentation on third project and sketches due for 2 nd project on Thurs., 1/24; engobes as surface technique for 261.

Week 7 2/11-14	Sketches due for 5 th & FINAL project Tues., 2/12: discussion and slide presentation: Etruscan ceramics. Wheel throwing techniques: lids: Project #3 should be completed by the end of the week.		
Week 8 2/19-21	HOLIDAY on Monday, 18 th ; Discussion and slide presentation on Pre-Columbian ceramics; load cone 10 gas kiln on Tues., 2/19 & fire Wed., 2/20; project #4 should be completed by the end of the week.		
Week 9 2/25-28	Last week for working with WET clay/greenware. Unload cone 10 gas kiln on Mon.2/25; ALL projects 1-5 need to be built by Thurs., 2/18.		
Week 10 3/4-7	Mon.,3/4 last bisque load for cone 10 glaze firing which is on Wed. 3/6 load final gas kiln cone 10 glaze firing and fire off on Thurs. 3/7; final earthenware bisque load on Thurs. 3/7; FINAL exam and group critique and grading on Project 2, Thursday 3/7. Studio clean-up/clean-out begins this week.		
Week 11 3/11-14	Mon. 3/11 unload cone 10 glaze firing; Tues.3/12 final earthenware cone 06-04 glaze firings and group critique on Project 3; Wed. 3/18 studio clean-up/clean-out continues; Thursday, 3/14 FINAL group critique with all ungraded work due during regular class meeting time. GRADING!
