## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This class is intended for students who have completed Photo I, Digital Photo I or Photo II. This class will enable continued use of the photography lab facilities in order to extend ones understanding of photography as a medium of artistic expression. The class will consist of 3 meetings – attendance is required during the first week, mid-term and final. Being that this is a darkroom course, students are required to provide a minimum of 10 prints that meet or exceed expectations in photograph craft and construction.

This is a Pass/Fail designated course. Work must meet a minimum grade of C or higher to Pass.

## **ATTENDANCE**

Meetings and critiques are mandatory and participation is required.

### GRADING

Factors considered into assigned grades: Effort, Attitude, Participation, Attendance, Technical Accomplishment, Aesthetic Aptitude, and Conceptual Exploration. Preferred qualities are signs of artistic growth and development, therefore, quality is emphasized over quantity.

Final grade breakdown is as follows:

10% First Meeting

25% Mid-term Critique (must have 6 working prints)

65% Final Critique ( must turn in 12 final prints )

Must have grade of C or higher for Pass.
