







An example of an equity gap




A Spotlight on Student Success: The Early Alert Program



- Systematic, Strategic Outreach
- Timely, proactive feedback
- Based on academic performance
- Faculty input on students early on
- Connects students to supports
- Develops a culture of care
- Increases persistence, retention and success



Early Alert for Academic Support



Supporting the Engage and Learn stages of the **Bulldog Trail** by providing personalized outreach to students in academic distress.





The Early Alert Process

Faculty observe and track student attendance, participation and performance. Student services emails/calls student. Student is connected to resources.

Faculty complete an Early Alert for student to Flag for follow-up. Student services closes loop with faculty on status of outreach.



Criteria for an Early Alert

Faculty are *encouraged* to submit an alert for students who:

- Never attended class
- Have low performance on tests
- Missed assignments
- Missed classes/stopp ed logging in to CANVAS, or
- Lack technology access

The Early Alert: Spring Pilot

Alerts submitted 251 Individual students 227 Emails sent out 186 Successful calls 79

Common issues identified by students:

- Access to Internet
- Canvas issues
- Didn't think anything was due
- Difficulty focusing
- Difficulty adjusting to online learning
