








Achieving the Dream **

With an emphasis on **closing equity gaps** for underrepresented student populations




To close equity gaps, BC ensures every student will...

What is Guided Pathways (or BC Pathways)?

	s is framework for redesigning colleges success—starting with end goals in mind
Clarify paths to student end goals	 Backward map all programs from good jobs and/or transfer in a major Organize programs by field (meta-major) to facilitate exploration and engage students in an academic and career community
Help students get on a path	 Help all new students (including high school dual enrollment and adult ed students) explore options and interests, connect with an academic/career community, and make a purposeful program choice Replace prerequisite remediation with teaching students to be effective learners in college-level program foundation courses Ensure all new students have a term 1 "light the fire" learning experience Help all new students develop a full-program learning and financial plan by end of term 1
Keep students on path	 Redesign advising to allow case management by metamajor Schedule courses and monitor students' progress based on plans
Ensure students are learning along their path	 Introduce students to practice of the field through active learning in classes Ensure every student gains program-relevant experience

Where are we now with Pathways mapping?

- Most Focus Area Faculty Teams have completed Phase 1 Course Maps and an Equity Reflection. Course maps are designed to help students easily determine what courses to take to achieve their goals.
- Phase 2 mapping will be more interdisciplinary. It involves using Gen Ed outcomes and degree requirements to recommend courses in other focus areas.
- Over the summer, focus area teams in Communication Studies, English, & Math piloted the Phase 2 work we'll be doing in 2021-22.
- We want to complete these maps in Fall/Winter, so we can begin implementing key elements of Pathways in Spring 2022.



COVID'S MENTAL STRESS

The percentage of people experiencing symptoms of depression and anxiety has surged amid the COVID-19 pandemic, data from nationally representative surveys show.

- Young adults (ages 18-24)
- Adults with job loss or lower incomes
- Women with children, and women in general
- Non-Hispanic Black adults and Hispanic or Latino adults (46%)
- Essential workers

Impact of Covid-19

- Prolonged grief disorder
- Increase in binge drinking, addictions and opioid related overdoses
- Increase in <u>suicidal ideation</u>
- Increase in job burnout (exhaustion, inefficacy and cynicism)
- Increase in <u>loneliness</u>
- <u>Coronoasomnia</u> increase in sleep disorders
- <u>Languishing</u> joylessness and aimlessness puts people at higher risk for mental illness



Culture of Care

We need to care for each other and ourselves.

WHAT CAN WE DO?	HOW?	
Create awareness on how to identify, understand and respond to mental health	Recognize mental health as an issue we are facing. Talk about it. Train anyone who is willing in mental health first aid.	
Engage with our students and each other. Celebrate wins – whatever that looks like.	Hold informal spaces/breaks to chat Build in transition time between meetings Celebrate small wins and appreciate others	
Create a community with a culture of care.	Don't be reactive or assume the worst. Take time for yourself, show grace with yourself and others	
One of the best ways of helping ourselves is to help others.	Refer students and staff to resources such as the hotline and counseling services; listen and be ther each other
