- <u>BC Pathways</u> Pathway maps are being finalized; developing a webbased program mapper tool to enable students to see sample course sequences; exploratory open houses in development.

- <u>Faculty Professional Development</u> Onboarding new faculty; culturalresponsive teaching module; faculty evaluation revisioning team to reduce bias and improve faculty retention; faculty coaching. *Lead(s):* Jenn Pang, Jennifer Parada

 Integrated Student Supports –Updating "Connect 1-2-3" flyer; assemble subgroups for collaborations and progress in New Student Orientation (NSO), intake form, and Early Alert; restart of ISS Collective Winter 2023.

- Math Re-design Math 076 replaces Math 070, 075, and 097; co-requisite Math 099/141 course is in implementation; Math 107 and Math 130 co-requisite is in development; set in-person proctoring as required for all math classes starting Fall 2022.

- <u>Data Team</u> Identified Leading Indicators (LI); set target goals; created a LI dashboard to view data that can be filtered and disaggregated in real time.

 Peer Educators Program - Integrates student voice in BC's Guided Pathways work; revamping the Office of Student Engagement site (Club site); support areas include Early Alert, Welcome Center, MCS, and the ATD Communications team.

- First-Year Seminar FYS 101 (or equivalent) required for AAS-DTA students; gives students tools for success within their first two quarters at BC; optimizing communications and procedures to ensure students take this course in their first year.

- <u>Umoja & Puente Programs</u> MCS cohort programs for African American/Black and Latinx students; attracts diverse faculty; coordinators/instructors refine the curriculum, provide specialized supports, and recruit students.

- <u>Communications</u> Developed three project teams lead by student Peer Educators; centralized communications channel; distribute ATD/Guided Pathways newsletter to campus; created content and a video for studentfacing website.
