Guided Pathways

The focus of <u>Guided Pathways</u> (GP) is to increase the number of underrepresented students earning college degrees. Towards this goal, **BC's Guided Pathways Team** have gone above and beyond in working with faculty, staff, and students to accomplish BC's 2022 goals.

What's Happening:

Welcome our new course mapping leads, Katherine Medbury-Oleson and Jacqueline Miller!

- Faculty teams completed Course Maps, which are designed to help students make informed decisions about which courses to take to achieve their goals.
- The Pathways Website Advisory sub-committee have developed criteria to ensure that course maps are accessible and user-friendly for students. A survey was also conducted in FYS sections so students could weigh in on the possible options.
- Representatives of the STEM Pathway held their first event for students interested in exploring STEM focus areas. Students who participated were able to engage with Science Division faculty in informal conversations and hands-on activities.
