Our board members show up.

As a Foundation board member, you would:

- Attend and actively contribute to Foundation Board meetings. Attendance should exceed 80% for the calendar year, barring extenuating circumstances.
- Actively participate on at least one Board committee, in addition to serving on either the Development or Scholarship/Programs committees.
- Attend the Annual Foundation Fundraising event (gala, breakfast, lunch or other).
- Attend and support key Foundation events (e.g. Donor & Scholar Reception, annual breakfast) and participate in select college events as a representative of the Foundation Board.
- Attend the Annual Board Retreat and an orientation.
- Provide advocacy for Bellevue College as needed.

Our board members lead by example.

They inspire financial contributions by others through their own giving. While amounts are a personal decision, our board members contribute and participate in the following:

- **Annual Fund:** Make an annual, meaningful, unrestricted gift to the Foundation. The suggested amount is \$1,500 or more.
- **Annual Fundraiser:** Fill at least one table of 10 people with invited guests/donors.
- Special Capital Campaigns: Make or solicit meaningful gifts.
- Donor stewardship and cultivation: Take initiative to inform
 Foundation staff members about opportunities for funding,
 and assist with the identification, cultivation, solicitation
 and stewardship of current and prospective donors.





Our board members act with care.

- All members have Legal Responsibilities referred to as
 Duty of Care, Duty of Loyalty and Duty of Obedience.
- Directors establish and follow policies to ensure the income and assets of the Foundation are invested and applied wisely through the review of regular financial statements, budgets, and audits.
- Ensure that the intent of charitable gifts is carried out by the Foundation.
- Sign the annual **conflict of interest** policy.

Our board members give their time.

Their **monthly time commitment averages 5–8 hours** for true engagement, with large event months requiring a bit more.

- There are **five board meetings per year**, plus a half day retreat.
- Other committees meet 3-5 times per year.
- Most meetings are **90 minutes**; some are just one hour.
- Other hours are spent on **engagement activities** and **attending events** on campus.
