



### **Lockwood Foundation Grant for BC Faculty Excellence & Innovation**

The Lockwood Foundation Grant, administered by the BC Foundation, is awarded to faculty members in support of new or ongoing projects that promote innovation in teaching and/or advance entrepreneurial models at the college. These grants, made available through a generous donation from the Lockwood Foundation, typically range from \$2,500–\$10,000.

#### **BC Foundation Mini-Grants**

Ranging from \$300-\$3,000, BC Foundation Mini-Grants are open to all faculty and staff and support ongoing projects, one-time projects, and new programs that may not be eligible for support through other college funding sources. Preference is given to projects that are consistent with the college's strategic plan, as well as the President's and Foundation's priorities. The program is funded by donors to the BC Foundation, including many BC faculty and staff. This year's recipients were awarded a total of \$19,016.


