 - Remember, dropping a class could negatively impact your ability to receive financial aid in the future, so check with Financial Aid first
- o **International Students**: Consult with your <u>International Education</u> Advisor

 - o Remember, to be eligible for Housing you must be enrolled in at least 6 credits
- Workforce Education: Consult with your <u>Workforce Education</u> advisor before dropping any classes.
