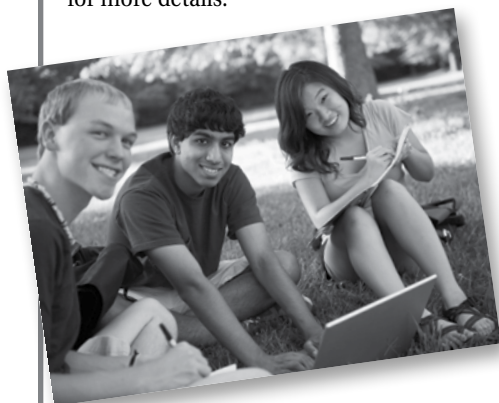
BC's OLS Program for Underserved Students Population Goes National

With the guidance of BC's Occupational Life Skills (OLS) staff, two out-of-state colleges – Lone Star-Tomball in Houston and Northwest Arkansas Community College in Bentonville – are replicating BC's successful OLS program. Taught at BC's North Campus, OLS is an innovative program unlike any other program in the nation, giving adults with cognitive disabilities the opportunity to acquire an accredited college degree that leads to post-graduation employment. The OLS Program, developed at BC 14 years ago, is a cohort model, which means that a group of students progress collectively through the courses. The program uses a scaffold approach to learning, which moves students progressively toward stronger understanding of the content and ultimately to becoming independent in the learning process. Your First Time Going to College?

Step 1: Apply for Admissions and Determine Funding

Apply for admissions at www.bellevuecollege.edu. If applying for Financial Aid, apply early and be aware of deadlines.

Step 2: Assess English and Math Skills

Take the assessment at Testing Services, 1st floor, B building. Bring your BC SID#, a valid photo ID and a credit/debit card or check to pay the fee. Go to www.bellevuecollege.edu/testing/compass to view the assessment schedule and to learn more.

Step 3: Attend a Bellevue Advising & Registration Kickoff (BARK) Session

Sign up for a session here: www.bellevuecollege.edu/advising/first-time or visit Academic Advising on the 2nd floor of B-building to sign-up in person. Bring your English and Math assessment scores to your 90-minute session. You will receive information at BARK to assist you in choosing your first quarter classes.

Step 4: Register for your classes, including a first quarter student success course

You will receive hands-on assistance with online registration as part of your BARK session. There are two first quarter student success courses: The First Year Experience (FYE) and the Comprehensive Success Initiative (CSI). You will enroll into one of them as part of your first quarter schedule.

Course Fees

In addition to the above tuition, mandatory fees include:

- A comprehensive fee of \$1.50 per credit with a \$15.00 maximum
- A commute reduction fee of \$1.70 per credit with a \$17.00 maximum.
- A technology fee of \$3.50 per credit 1-10 credits and \$3.50 per credit beyond 18 credits.
- An environmental sustainability fee of \$1.00 per credit with a \$10. Maximum.
- Certain courses require fees for laboratory use, licensing, and other costs. These fees are identified in the class schedule

Fee for eLearning Courses

Residency for Tuition Purposes

If you are classified as a non-resident and would like to know how to become eligible to pay resident tuition, please call the Residency Office at (425) 564-4143 for information, or go online to www.bellevuecollege.edu/admissions/eligibility. Note: Non-resident students enrolled in **only online classes** may be eligible for a tuition reduction. Costs for Self-Support Programs

Tuition for Self-Support Programs

(ie: Upper division Interior Design, lower level Alcohol & Drug Counseling, Fire Science, etc.)

Some programs are self-supporting – that is, they do not receive state funding. They have their own tuition structures and do not grant tuition and fee waivers. In these programs you pay the full fee, regardless of your residency status. Self-support fees are listed with courses in the quarterly class schedule.

Self-support programs (except bachelor's programs) charge the same amounts for residents and non-residents. Self-support bachelor's degree students pay \$245.45 per credit for all credits beyond 18.

Fee for Continuing Education Courses

Fees for Continuing Education classes are listed in the quarterly Continuing Education schedule. Residency in Washington State is not required for some of these classes; in these cases, all students are charged the same stated fees regardless of residency status.

Tuition and fees must be paid by the deadline. Classes may be dropped by the Registration Office for non-payment. Adding then dropping and re-registering for the same class before the quarter begins does not extend or renew the time for payment.

You may pay your tuition and fees by VISA or MasterCard online at <https://www.ctc.edu/~bellevue/wccba/waci600.html> or at the cashier's office in the Student Services Building. You may pay by check through the mail, or by check or cash at the cashier's office. You are responsible for verifying that payment has been made; for example, if you are receiving financial aid that comes directly to the college.

Refunds for College Withdrawal or Dropped Classes

If you withdraw from the college or drop classes, you may be eligible for a refund. The college begins to process refunds after the fifth day of classes. A processing fee is deducted from the refund amount. The amount refunded is based on your withdrawal or drop date for courses that begin the first week of the quarter. See calendar (p. 5) for deadlines for 100% and 50% refunds. Classes with alternate start and end dates are governed by a different refund policy. The information is available on the Enrollment Calendar at www.bellevuecollege.edu/enrollment/calendar/deadlines/. If the college drops you from classes for disciplinary reasons you will not be eligible for a refund. Some fees are identified as nonrefundable in the class listings. Self-supporting programs may have different refund policies. Contact the program office for details. Refunds under \$25 will not be processed but will be applied to the next academic quarter. Visit www.bellevuecollege.edu/tuition/ for more information about refunds.

Drop for Non-Payment

Non-payment of tuition and course-related fees (including returned check and/or credit cards) may result in the student being withdrawn from some or all classes. (BC Policy 7250). A withdrawal fee will be charged if you have ever been dropped for non-payment in the past. Returned checks and/or credit card charges are assessed a fee.

Admission to or registration for classes, conferring of degrees, and issuance of academic transcripts may be withheld for failure to meet financial obligations to the college and may result in the account being sent to a collection service (BC Policy 5150). All collection fees are the responsibility of the check/credit card writer and/or the student. If a student writes three checks (including third-party checks) which are returned, his/ her privilege of check-writing will be denied.

Final Examination Schedule

Summer Quarter final exams are given on the last regularly-scheduled class date unless otherwise arranged with the approval of the Office of Instruction.

Student Confidentiality/Records: FERPA

Notice is hereby given that all students at Bellevue College are protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), of 1974. The college has adopted institutional procedures in compliance with Public Law 93-380, FERPA. Your privacy is protected with certain restrictions on the disclosure of your student educational records and information. You have the following rights, protection and privacy of your educational records at Bellevue College.

- 1) The right to inspect and review your student education records within 45 days, the college receives a written request for access. Students must submit a written request to the Director of Enrollment Services identifying the record(s) they wish to inspect.
- 2) The right to request the amendment of the student's educational records the student believes inaccurate. A written request identifying the records in question and justification of why it is inaccurate must be sent to the Director of Enrollment Services.
- 3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's educational records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. The college will disclose the following directory information (name of student, degree or certificate awarded, dates of attendance, athletic statistics, scholarships received, membership or position in BC student government or honor society, part-time or full-time student status, previous schools attended, BC e-mail address.) Exceptions to disclose includes those records requested by subpoena, in emergency situations, in compliance with the Solomon Amendment (Military requests), Department of Education requests, IRS Hope Scholarship and Lifetime Learning tax credit programs and information provided to the National Student Clearinghouse. Students may request through written notice, that the college does not release directory information at the Enrollment Services Office.
- 4) The right to file a complaint with the US Department of Education concerning alleged failures by Bellevue College to comply with the requirements of FERPA.

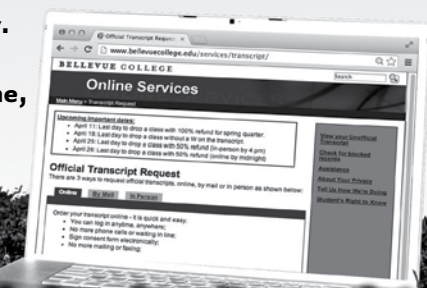

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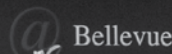

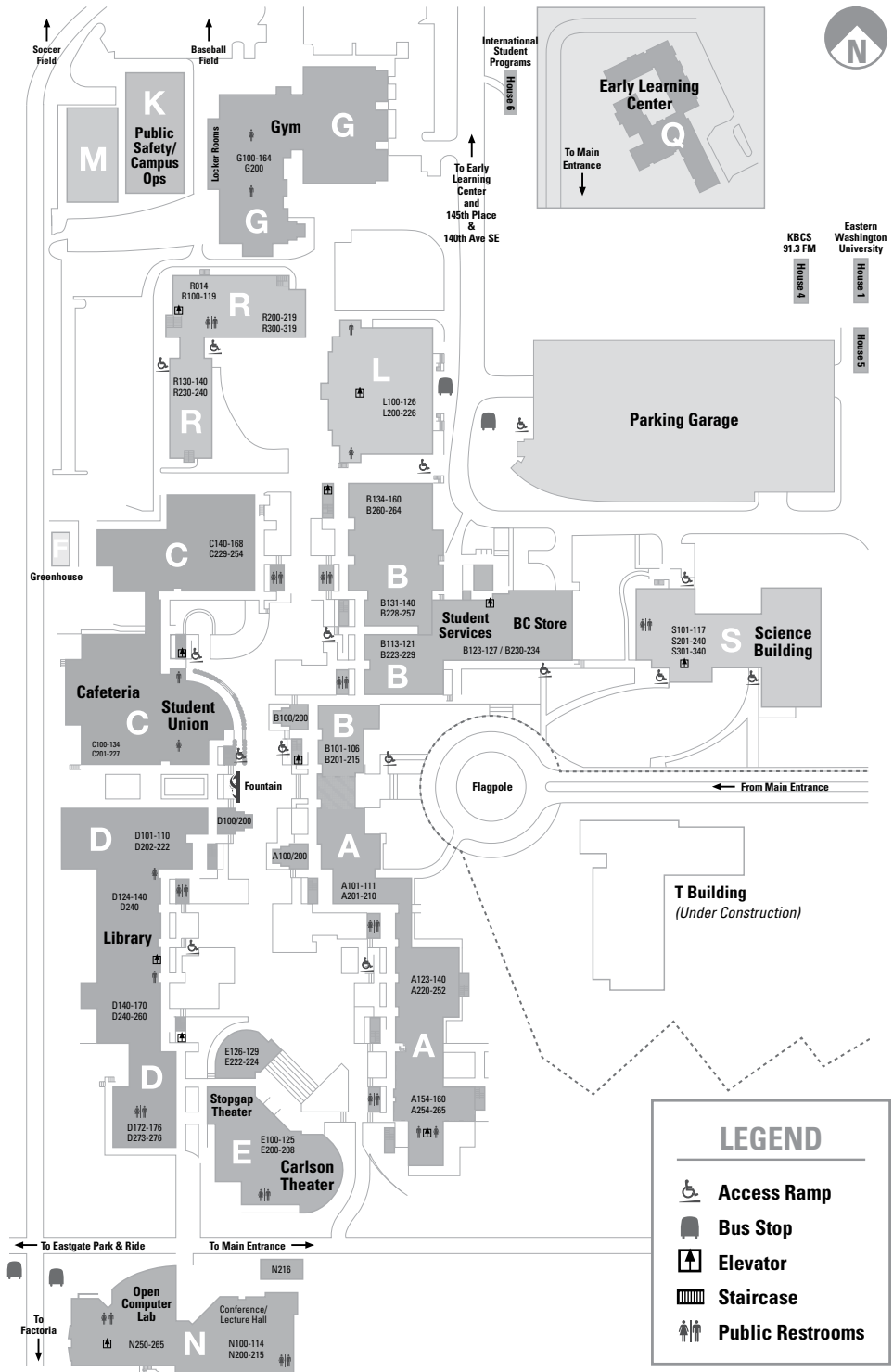
MAIN CAMPUS MAP

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› DATA ANALYTICS (BAS)

In this visionary degree program, students explore the methods, concepts, and tools needed to solve real-life data problems with innovative and effective results, applicable to multiple industries and using combined business/scientific problem solving processes.

› HEALTHCARE TECHNOLOGY & MANAGEMENT (BAS)

A career-oriented bachelor degree program designed to prepare individuals to successfully compete for jobs that require knowledge of the healthcare system, information technology knowledge and skills, and supervisory or management skills. The degree program offers two degree concentrations specializing in either Healthcare Information Technology or Healthcare Management.

› INFORMATION SYSTEMS & TECHNOLOGY (BAS)

Graduates of the BAS in IST will have a broad base of theoretical and technical knowledge, as well as specialized knowledge in one of four concentration areas: Application Development, Business Intelligence, Information Security or Systems Administration.

› INTERIOR DESIGN (BAA)

This broadly-based and professionally-relevant degree prepares and inspires the designers of the future. The BAA program is accredited as a professional level degree by the Council for Interior Design Accreditation (CIDA). The degree offers a combination of core courses, general education and electives that helps students achieve their career goals.

› NURSING (RN-BSN)

Builds upon the academic foundations and experience of the Associate Degree prepared nurse. The RN to BSN program enhances professional values and role development, scholarly inquiry, leadership, communication skills, health information technology and community and public health. This prepares graduates to be managers of care, providers of care and active members of the profession.

› RADIATION & IMAGING SCIENCES (BAS)

Designed to prepare radiation and imaging professionals to successfully compete for jobs that require highly developed technical skills, advanced certifications or supervisory and management skills. The degree completion program is designed for certified professionals in radiologic technology, diagnostic ultrasound, radiation therapy, or nuclear medicine.
