Lectures Headline Earth Week

April 22-26, 2013

Bellevue College will celebrate Earth Week on April 22-26 with numerous events and a series of lectures around this year's theme: Living with Climate Change. Most events will take place in the college's cafeteria and student union (Building C, next to the fountain and in the courtyard in the center of BC's main campus, located at 3000 Landerholm Circle SE in Bellevue).

Earth Week, sponsored by BC's Sustainability and Science Association, began 14 years ago as an effort to promote environmental awareness and sustainable use of our planet's resources. "This year's Earth Week will give our students and the public the opportunity to learn more about the impacts of climate change," said Dr. Robert Viens, dean of the college's Science Division and organizer of Earth Week. "We are emphasizing issues around climate change ranging from science of climate to the social justice impacts and economic ramifications." According to the Earth Day Organization website, "Climate change can seem like a remote problem for many, but the fact is that it's already impacting real people, animals, and beloved places all over the world."

Two speakers on opening day include Dr. Cliff Mass, UW Atmospheric Sciences, "Effects of Local Climate Change" at 9:30am, and Dr. Simone Alin, UW Oceanography, "Ocean Acidification" at 11:30am. Topics by additional speakers include renewable energy, genetically modified food, capping carbon, climate and ancient cultures, climate change and biodiversity, climate change and food, and climate ethics.

Additional events include several films about environmental issues and the fourth-annual BC Farmer's Market, featuring a small number of local vendors selling fruits, vegetables, honey and dairy products. Your First Time Going to College?

Step 1: Apply for Admissions

Apply at bellevuecollege.edu.

Step 2: Assess English and Math Skills

Take the assessment at the Assessment Office, 1st floor, B132F.

- Bring your BC SID#, a valid photo ID and a credit/debit card or check to pay fee.
- No appointment needed. Just drop-in. Go to bellevuecollege.edu/enrollment/assessment to view the assessment schedule.
- The assessment is not timed, but plan for about 2-3 hours.

Step 3: Meet with a New Student Advisor to Select Your Classes

You are required to meet with an advisor prior to registering for classes. On or after your assigned registration appointment time, drop-in during the following hours:

Step 4: Register for your Classes and FYE

You receive hands-on assistance with online registration immediately following your advising session. There are two freshman student success programs: the Comprehensive Success Initiative (CSI) and the First Year Experience (FYE). Your advisor will help you identify into which one you are required to enroll.

Step 5: Pay Your Tuition

Tuition and fees must be paid within seven calendar days after registration, or by the first day of the quarter, whichever comes first. Once the quarter begins, payment is due immediately at time of registration.

Transferring-in or have Prior College Experience?

Step 1: Apply for Admissions

Previous BC students who have been absent for four or more quarters must re-apply at bellevuecollege.edu.

Step 2: Determine Completion of Prerequisites and English/Math Placement

- **Prerequisites:** If you have taken courses from another institution that meet our course prerequisites, visit bellevuecollege.edu/enrollment/transfer/prerequisites to learn about the procedure to clear prerequisites for registration purposes.
- **Math and English:** If you have not completed a 100-level math and/or English course, take the skills assessment prior to meeting with an advisor. Learn more at: bellevuecollege.edu/enrollment/assessment/testing

Step 3: Meet with an Academic Advisor

While meeting with an academic advisor is recommended, it is not required. Academic advisors provide an unofficial review of your previous credits and assist with course selection.

- (1) Residents pay \$1,492.32 for 18 cr + \$96.26 additional per credit beyond 18
- (2) Non-Residents pay \$3,252.40 for 18 cr + \$268.26 additional per credit beyond 18

2012-2013 Tuition for upper division courses (299 & above)

- (3) Bachelor's Program Residents pay \$2,533.54 for 18 cr + \$234.87 additional per credit beyond 18
- (4) Bachelor's Program Non-Residents pay \$6,068.76 for 18 cr + \$587.84 additional per credit beyond 18

In addition to the above tuition, mandatory fees are:

- A comprehensive fee of \$1.50 per credit with a \$15. Maximum
- A commute reduction fee of \$2.00 per credit with a \$20. Maximum.
- A technology fee of \$3.50 per credit 1-10 credits and \$3.50 per credit beyond 18 credits.
- An environmental sustainability fee of \$1.00 per credit with a \$10. Maximum.

Fee for Distance Education Courses

Telecourses and online/hybrid courses have a fee which pays for hardware, software and licensing. These fees are identified in the Credit Class Schedule next to each Distance Education course.

Residency for Tuition Purposes

If you are classified as a non-resident and would like to know how to become eligible to pay resident tuition, please call the Residency Office at (425) 564-4143 for information, or go online to www.bellevuecollege.edu/enrollment/admissions/eligibility. Note: Non-resident students enrolled in **only online classes** may be eligible for a tuition reduction. For more information, please call (425) 564-2222 or email enrollment@bellevuecollege.edu and ask about the "Distance Education Waiver".

Self-supporting programs charge the same amounts for residents and non-residents.

Costs for Self-Support Programs

Tuition for Self-Support Programs

(ie: Upper division Interior Design, lower level Alcohol & Drug Counseling, Fire Science, etc.)

Some programs are self-supporting - that is, they do not receive state funding. They have their own tuition structures and do not grant tuition and fee waivers. In these programs you pay the full fee, regardless of your residency status. Self-support fees are listed with courses in the quarterly class schedule.

Fee for Continuing Education Courses

Fees for Continuing Education classes are listed in the quarterly Continuing Education schedule. Residency in Washington State is not required for some of these classes; in these cases, all students are charged the same stated fees regardless of residency status.

Payment Information

Tuition and fees must be paid within seven (7) calendar days from the first day you register for classes OR by the first day of the quarter, whichever comes first. Classes may be dropped by the Registration Office for non-payment. Adding then dropping and re-registering for the same class before the quarter begins does not extend or renew the seven (7) original calendar days. **Registrations on or after the first day of the quarter require immediate payment at the time of registration.** There is no grace period once the quarter has begun. If you register after the third day of the quarter, you must obtain a blue permission card from the instructor to enroll. If you register on or after July 3, you must obtain a red permission card from the instructor and pay a late registration fee for each course in addition to regular tuition and fees. You are responsible for learning the exact amount of tuition and fees due. Find this information from your class schedule online at <http://bellevuecollege.edu/services/schedule.asp>.

You may pay your tuition and fees by VISA or MasterCard online at <https://www.ctc.edu/~bellevue/wccba/waci600.html> or at the cashier's office in the Student Services Building. You may pay by check through the mail, or by check or cash at the cashier's office. You are responsible for verifying that payment has been made; for example, if you are receiving financial aid that comes directly to the college.

Refunds for College Withdrawal or Dropped Classes

If you withdraw from the college or drop classes, you may be eligible for a refund. The college begins to process refunds after the third day of classes. A processing fee is deducted from the refund amount. The amount refunded is based on your withdrawal or drop date for courses that begin the first week of the quarter. See calendar (p. 5) for deadlines for 100% and 50% refunds. Classes with alternate start and end dates are governed by a different refund policy. The information is available on the Enrollment Calendar at <http://bellevuecollege.edu/enrollment/calendar/deadlines/>. If the college drops you from classes for disciplinary reasons you will not be eligible for a refund. Some fees are identified as nonrefundable in the class listings. Self-supporting programs may have different refund policies. Contact the program office for details. Refunds under \$25 will not be processed but will be applied to the next academic quarter. Visit <http://bellevuecollege.edu/enrollment/tuition/> for more information about refunds.

Drop for Non-Payment

Non-payment of tuition and course-related fees (including returned check and/or credit cards) may result in the student being withdrawn from

some or all classes. (BC Policy 7250). A withdrawal fee will be charged if you have ever been dropped for non-payment in the past. Returned checks and/or credit card charges are assessed a fee.

Admission to or registration for classes, conferring of degrees, and issuance of academic transcripts may be withheld for failure to meet financial obligations to the college and may result in the account being sent to a collection service (BC Policy 5150). All collection fees are the responsibility of the check/credit card writer and/or the student. If a student writes three checks (including third-party checks) which are returned, his/ her privilege of check-writing will be denied. Transcript Fee

Final Examination Schedule

Summer Quarter final exams are given on the last regularly-scheduled class date unless otherwise arranged with the approval of the Office of Instruction.

Student Confidentiality/Records: FERPA

Notice is hereby given that all students at Bellevue College are protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), of 1974. The college has adopted institutional procedures in compliance with Public Law 93-380, FERPA. Your privacy is protected with certain restrictions on the disclosure of your student educational records and information. You have the following rights, protection and privacy of your educational records at Bellevue College.

- 1) The right to inspect and review your student education records within 45 days, the college receives a written request for access. Students must submit a written request to the Associate Dean of Enrollment Services identifying the record(s) they wish to inspect.
- 2) The right to request the amendment of the student's educational records the student believes inaccurate. A written request identifying the records in question and justification of why it is inaccurate must be sent to the Associate Dean of Enrollment Services.
- 3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's educational records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. The college will disclose the following directory information (name of student, degree or certificate awarded, dates of attendance, athletic statistics, scholarships received, membership or position in BC student government or honor society, part-time or full-time student status, previous schools attended, BC e-mail address.) Exceptions to disclose includes those records requested by subpoena, in emergency situations, in compliance with the Solomon Amendment (Military requests), Department of Education requests, IRS Hope Scholarship and Lifetime Learning tax credit programs and information provided to the National Student Clearinghouse. Students may request through written notice, that the college does not release directory information at the Student Services Office.
- 4) The right to file a complaint with the US Department of Education concerning alleged failures by Bellevue College to comply with the requirements of FERPA.

To register online, you'll need:

- Item numbers for classes you want to take (use the online Schedule Planner, or check the Credit Class Schedule; determine alternates)
- Your Student ID number and Personal Identification Number (PIN)
- Registration access – A current student or a returning student who earned credits in any of the four previous quarters or new students who submitted an admissions application with the non-refundable fee will be assigned an access time, viewable at <http://bellevuecollege.edu/services/appointment.asp>.

All registering students will receive registration information, including your access time, via your e-mail. If you don't receive this information, make sure the college has your correct e-mail address; check the website or visit the Student Services Center. You may register for classes on the Web from your assigned access time through the second day of the academic quarter. You may drop or withdraw from classes on the Web until the end of the seventh week of the quarter.

Entry Code: a 5-digit number you get from the division office, allowing you to register for a class that requires prerequisites or "permission of instructor."






MAIN CAMPUS MAP
