

# New Career Program Offerings from BCC

This year, BCC provides more career program options for students! BCC will offer new degrees and certificates in information technology, accounting, marketing and sales, media communication and more during the coming academic year.

Here's a sample of new program offerings:

- Accounting Information Systems Certificate
  Learn to analyze accounting system needs; perform, analyze and record transactions; and prepare and communicate managerial accounting analyses using a variety of accounting software programs.
- Computing Security Professional Certificate
  Identify key security risks associated with managing data
  on computer networks, then learn to design and
  implement security applications, policies and
  procedures.
- Information Technology Certificates
   Get specific training towards Microsoft Certified Systems
   Engineer (MCSE) or Cisco Certified Network Associate
   (CCNA) certification.
- Mobile Computing Degree or Certificate

#### **Tibetan Scholar to Teach at BCC**

Tibetan scholar Nawang Dorjee will join the faculty as BCC's inaugural "Scholar in Residence" as part of BCC's new Center for Liberal Arts program. Dorjee, a renowned Tibetan educator and Director of the Tibetan Children's Village in Dharamsala, India, will share his knowledge of Tibetan culture and history with students, faculty, staff and community members as a teacher and guest lecturer during his nine-month tenure at BCC.



During fall quarter, Dorjee will teach "Humanities 228: Modern Tibetan History and Culture." He will discuss the Tibetan way of life and culture prior to the Chinese occupation; the journey of the Dalai Lama and over 100,000 Tibetans as they sought refuge in India, Nepal, Bhutan and the West; and Buddhist beliefs through the teachings of the Dalai Lama.

The five-credit class, Humanities 228, will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:30 – 4:40 p.m. on the main BCC campus during fall quarter. ## **Campus Construction Update**



Students will find new amenities and expanded service areas when construction is complete on several campus projects this summer. After an extensive renovation, the Student Services Building (Building B) will reopen in August with more space to serve students. Program offices for Enrollment Services, Admissions, Career Center and Disability Support Services, among other programs, will return to Building B.

Students and staff can fuel up on caffeine when a new coffee bar opens this fall in Building R on the north end of campus. At the main campus entrance, the City of Bellevue will reconfigure the entrance to the college off 148th Ave S.E. starting this summer. As a result of this project, a new roundabout will replace the three-way stop sign near the circle drive by Building B, and Parking Lot #7 near the existing college entrance will be reconfigured to accommodate the new

entrance. Construction on a new parking garage, which will provide over 600 new student parking spaces on campus, will begin in November, with completion scheduled for late 2003.





# general information

#### **Basic Information**

#### **Eligibility for BCC**

If you are 18 or older or have earned a high school diploma, you are welcome to apply for admission and take college credit classes. High school students may enroll at BCC; contact the High School Programs Office, (425) 564-2026.

#### College Credit Classes / Non-Credit Continuing Education

This Schedule deals primarily with college credit classes—classes that usually require homework, exams, etc. and that result in a grade recorded on your official student transcript. BCC also offers a wide variety of noncredit Continuing Education classes. If you plan to take non-credit Continuing Education classes only, you do not need to apply for admission, and the policies and procedures will be different from those listed here. Call (425) 564-2263, check www.conted.bcc.ctc.edu, or consult the Continuing Education publication for more information.

# How to Enroll in Credit Classes

#### 1. Admission

If you are new to BCC or returning after being gone two or more quarters, you will need to apply for admission. For an admissions application, see page 11 or go to the BCC website, www.bcc.ctc.edu/wts. If you send in your application before the admissions deadline (see calendar, p. 6), you will receive a letter setting up a registration time and telling you about assessment, advising, and other steps in becoming a BCC student. You also can learn your registration time by Remote Access.

If you do not meet the admissions deadline, you still will be able to register for classes – see Registration section below.

#### 2. Assessment

BCC's "combined assessment" process identifies your skill level and appropriate placement in English and math. Assessment is required before registering for some classes and is strongly recommended to help all students succeed. Assessment also can help you meet the prerequisites listed for various classes. There is a \$15 fee for assessment. Stop by the Assessment

Office to determine your need to assess. Students may drop-in to take the tests between 1:00 and 5:45 p.m. on Mondays or between 9:00 a.m. and 5:45 p.m. Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Check the BCC website, www.bcc.ctc.edu, for more information (click on "How to Enroll").

If you completed college-level math or English at another college, you may not need assessment at BCC. Bring your transcripts from the other institution (and course descriptions, if that institution is out of state) to the Assessment Office for review.

#### 3. Academic Advising

Planning your class schedule with an advisor will help you make good choices while you are here. Registration/Advising workshops give new students useful information about registration and assessment processes, schedule planning, and campus contacts. These workshops will help you select classes that will apply to your degree or transfer program and avoid enrolling in classes that might not transfer to the institution you want to attend after BCC.

A schedule of these workshops will be included in the letter with your registration appointment information, or see the website for more information: www.bcc.ctc.edu/advising/AdvRegLtr.htm.

#### 4. Registration by Remote Access

If you are:

- A current student or a returning student who earned credits in the two previous quarters OR
- A new student or a returning student who earned credits more than two quarters ago AND who submitted an admission application by the deadline (see calendar, p. 6) –

you will be assigned a registration access time. You can check this time by Remote Access. You will also receive registration information including your "access time" in the mail. If you don't receive this information, make sure the college has your correct address – check the website or visit the Student Service Center. You may register for classes by Remote Access from your assigned access time through the third day of the academic quarter. You may drop or withdraw from classes by Remote Access until the end of the seventh week.

#### If you are:

• A new or former student who missed the application deadline (see p. 6) –

you will be assigned an access time for remote registration within 48 hours after your application is received by the Admissions Office. You may register for classes by Remote Access from your assigned access time through the third day of the academic quarter You may drop or withdraw from classes by Remote Access until the end of the seventh week.

Remote Access Registration is available Monday - Friday, 6:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m., and Saturday 6:00 a.m. through Sunday noon:

- Touchtone registration dial (425) 564-2625

To use either type of Remote Access, you must know your Student Identification Number and your Personal Identification Number (PIN). Your birth date is initially assigned as your PIN. For your own protection, please change your PIN the first time you use Remote Access.

Need help with registration? Call (425) 564-2222 or come to the Student Service Center.

#### Registration for Distance Education:

BCC offers a variety of televised and online courses. You may register for these classes by Remote Access (Touchtone or BCC website) at any time through the third day of the quarter. If you need a registration form to be sent to you in hard copy, call (425) 564-2438. See page 39 for Distance Education requirements and fees.

#### 5. Payment

If you register after August 9, your tuition and fees are due within seven calendar days. If you register on or after the fourth day of the quarter, tuition & fees are due immediately upon submission of the permission-to-enroll card. If you register on or after October 5, a \$100 late-registration fee will be charged for each course in addition to the regular tuition & fees.

The sections below give basic information about tuition, fees, waivers, refunds, etc., at BCC. You are responsible for learning the exact amount of tuition & fees due. You can find this information several ways:

- by Touchtone: dial (425) 564-2625, press 7#
- on the web at www.bcc.ctc.edu/wts
- at a kiosk in the Student Services Building or the Campus Information Center (C106 in the Student Union)
- in person at the Student Service Center

You may pay your tuition & fees by VISA or MasterCard at the time of Remote Access registration or at the Cashier's Office in the Student Services Building. You may pay by check through the mail, or by check or cash at the Cashier's Office.

You are responsible for verifying that payment has been made, for example if you are receiving financial aid that comes directly to the college.

If your check is returned because of a stoppayment, you will be charged \$25 and dropped from your classes immediately. If your check is returned because of insufficient funds, you will be charged \$15 and dropped from your classes after the college has notified you.

#### **Drop for Non-Payment:**

If you do not pay tuition & fees on time, the college may drop you from some or all of your classes.

You may be dropped from a class if you have not paid by the times noted under "Payment" above. You may also be blocked from registration and other student services until you pay the amount due.

If you are dropped from classes for non-payment, the college will notify you in writing after you have been withdrawn. You will be charged a \$15 fee for reinstatement into classes for that quarter. If you do not re-enroll, your future registration activity will not be affected.

#### What It Will Cost

#### **Tuition & Fees**

The following chart shows the basic tuition & fees per credit per quarter for residents and non-residents. (See "Residency" for definitions.) Additional fees are described below. All tuition & fee rates are subject to change by the Board of Trustees and/or the state legislature. Check the BCC website (www.bcc.ctc.edu) for current tuition and fee amounts.

(1) For 11 or more credits, residents will pay \$642.60 plus \$5.50 per credit up to 18 credits, plus \$56.70 per additional credit beyond 18.

(2) For 11 or more credits, non-residents will pay \$2,359.60 plus \$9.30 per credit up to 18 credits, plus \$228.40 per additional credit beyond 18.

#### Technology fee:

BCC has a technology fee to ensure that all credit students have access to computers and related technology in a quality learning environment. The fee is \$3.50 per credit, to a maximum of \$35 for up to 18 credits. The total tech and computer lab fees will be limited to \$115 per quarter for 10-18 credits.

E-mail accounts are available for credit students after the first day of the quarter in the Open Lab, room N250.

#### Other fees:

Certain classes require fees for laboratory use, licensing, etc. These fees are identified in the class listing. Tuition & fee waivers generally do not apply to these fees.

# Fees for Distance Education and Self-Supporting Programs:

The cost of each Distance Education class includes a licensing fee. For more information about Distance Education fees, call (425) 564-2438 or visit the website at <a href="http://distance-ed.bcc.ctc.edu">http://distance-ed.bcc.ctc.edu</a>.

Certain BCC programs are self-supporting—that is, they receive no state funding. They have their own fee structures and do not grant tuition & fee waivers. In these programs you pay the full course fee regardless of your residency status. Check the program description for details.

#### **Transcript fee**

The first three transcripts a student requests within one academic year are provided at no cost. There is a \$5 processing fee for each transcript ordered after the first three. For instructions on ordering transcripts, call (425) 564-2245 or go to the website at www.bcc.ctc.edu/wts/ofctran.stm.

#### **Waivers**

Some of your tuition & fees may be reduced ("waived") if you meet certain criteria. Waivers are available for eligible veterans, refugees, and some other categories of students. Contact the Student Service Center to ask about the eligibility rules. Waivers do not apply to technology fees, lab fees, etc., or to Distance Education or self-supporting programs.

#### Space-available waivers:

These waivers are available to seniors (60+ years old), state employees, and certain other groups. These waivers may be used for any class with a seat still available on the third day of the quarter. Specific information is available at the Student Service Center. Check the enrollment calendar for the registration time set aside for the eligible groups.

# Refunds for Withdrawing or Dropping

If you withdraw from the college or drop classes so that your credit total is less than 10, you may be eligible for a refund. The college begins to process refunds after the third day of classes. A \$7 processing fee is deducted from the refund amount.

The amount refunded is based on your withdrawal or drop date for courses that begin the first week of the quarter. See calendar (p. 6) for the last days for 100% and 50% refunds.

If the college drops you from classes for disciplinary reasons you will not be eligible for a refund. Some fees are identified as non-refundable in the class listings. Self-supporting programs may have different refund policies; contact the program office for details.

#### Residency

Your residency status determines your basic tuition & fee rate for most college credit classes. You are considered a Washington State resident if you are a U.S. citizen OR have permanent resident immigrant, refugee-parolee, or conditional entrant status, AND

#### general information

(1) you have been financially independent from your parents or legal guardians for the calendar year during which your college enrollment begins AND you established a domicile (residence) in Washington State for reasons other than your education at least one full year immediately prior to the first day of the guarter, OR

(2) you are a financially dependent student, and one or both of your parents or legal guardians maintained a domicile in the state of Washington for at least one year immediately prior to the first day of the quarter.

You can prove your legal residence in Washington by showing that you have done the following for one full year immediately prior to the beginning of the quarter:

- held a Washington driver's license,
- owned a vehicle registered in Washington,
- been registered to vote in Washington, and
- actually lived in the state (demonstrated by utility payments, etc.).

If you wish to have your status changed from non-resident to resident, you must submit a Residency Questionnaire, with supporting documentation, within 30 calendar days of the first day of the quarter. Questionnaires received after the 30th calendar day will be considered for the following quarter. Forms are available at the Student Service Center.

Note: Residency status affects tuition & fees for state-supported classes only. Self-supporting programs charge the same amounts for residents and non-residents.

#### **Grades**

Official grades are available approximately one week after the quarter ends. There are several ways to learn your grades:

- by Touchtone: dial (425) 564-2625, press 3#;
- on the BCC website: www.bcc.ctc.edu/wts/;
- at a kiosk in the Student Services Building or the Campus Information Center;
- by mail: leave a self-addressed stamped envelope at the Student Service Center, with your Student ID number written inside the flap;
- in person: at the Student Service Center.

#### **Final Exam Schedule**



# Summary of Parking and Traffic Regulations

Based on WAC 132H-116.

For more complete information about parking and traffic rules at BCC, contact Campus Security or Administrative Services.

Fines for violations range from \$10 to \$100.

#### **Parking Permits**

BCC students who have paid tuition and comprehensive fees are entitled to parking permits for their vehicles. Student parking permits (stickers) are available from the Cashier's Office (B126) or the Campus Security Office (K100). Student permits are required for parking in student lots, 6:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday - Friday.

#### **General Parking Rules**

Student daytime parking is limited to areas designated Student Parking.

Staff/faculty daytime parking is limited to areas designated Staff/Faculty Parking.

Evening parking, after 3:00 p.m., for students, staff, and faculty is available in all designated parking areas with the exceptions of parking spaces for the handicapped, the college motor pool, and specifically signed reserved areas. Students may not park in those lots designated as "Staff/Faculty Parking" with signage stating "No Student Parking Anytime Mon – Fri".

Park one vehicle to a space, between a set of white lines.


No one may park at any time in roadways, fire lanes, bus zones, loading zones, or service driveways; or on sidewalks; or in the landscaping. No one may park in a reserved space without the appropriate permit or authorization.

#### Students & Staff with Disabilities

You may park in a space reserved for the disabled only if your vehicle displays a valid "Disabled Persons Parking Identification Placard" issued by the State of Washington. Parking lot C-7 on the west side of campus is reserved for disabled parking. Most other parking lots include reserved spaces as well.

#### **Visitors**

Visitors on brief errands to BCC may park in Lot 7, or in the short-term parking stalls around campus.



Bellevue Community College assumes no liability for thefts or damage to vehicles parked or operated on campus. For your own protection, remove valuables and lock your vehicle.

#### Carpools

Lot 4-B is reserved for student carpools (3 or more people sharing 1 vehicle). Carpool permits are available from the Security Office and must be displayed on the dashboard of the carpool's vehicle.

#### Blocking the Roadway

Waiting in the parking lot roadway for a space to open up can create gridlock for everyone. Please be willing to come a little earlier or walk a little farther. Violators may be cited.

#### Speed Limit

The speed limit on campus is 20 miles per hour unless posted otherwise or unless driving conditions require a slower speed.

#### **Pedestrians**

Pedestrians have the right of way at all times. (Exception: pedestrians must yield to emergency vehicles using lights, sirens, etc.)


#### Citations and Appeals

You may be cited (get a ticket) for parking without a permit, parking in an unauthorized area, blocking a roadway, speeding, etc. If you do not pay the fine listed on the ticket, the college may delay your registration, place a hold on your transcripts or Financial Aid, or impound (tow away) your vehicle.

If you think the ticket was unjustified, do not pay the fine but fill out a citation appeal form in the Campus Security Office (K100) or Administrative Services Office (B202). You must file the appeal within 20 days after getting the ticket; after that time you must pay the fine.

Parents enrolling their children are required to participate in the Parent Involvement program.

Low income families may apply for enrollment in Head Start, an enhancement program available for children 3 and 4 years old. The program supports full time childcare, encourages parent involvement, and provides comprehensive social and health services to eligible families. Although you save time commuting to campus, you still need to put in the hours a college-level course requires to absorb material, read textbooks, and complete assignments and exams.






