Student Sustainability Guidelines: Students are expected to make decisions that have the smallest environmental impact while maximizing student learning. This includes:

- Think before printing documents for this class, print double sided, adjust the printable margins and reuse any paper as scratch paper.
- Turn in papers electronically or when necessary turn in printed assignments double sided, single spaced and using small margins of at least .75 inches.
- **Turn off the lights** in empty classrooms and do not study alone in classrooms or without permission.
- **Recycle** all paper, bottles and cans and **compost** food and materials from the cafeteria.
- Adjust the power settings on your personal computer so the monitor and CPU will sleep after 20 minutes of inactivity and unplug personal all electronic
