There are a few ways to get to Lake Hills Greenbelt and utilizing Google Maps is always a great place to start! Leave Bellevue College heading east on SE 24th St and make a left on 145th PI SE. Ride on 145th for about half a mile and then turn right onto Lake Hill Blvd. Lastly, make a right onto Lake to Lake Trail, keep left, and you'll find the destination to your right. Happy biking!
