New State Law Improves BC's Menstrual Product Program

BC's menstrual product program has expanded to improve equitable access to anyone in need. Thanks to state funds, nine new dispensers have been installed and more menstrual products have been purchased. House Bill 1273, a new state law, requires colleges and universities to provide free menstrual hygiene products by the beginning of the 2022-23 school year and Bellevue College is off to a great start. The new normal on campus is free, accessible menstrual products for all!
