Bike Everywhere Month was established in 1956 by the League of American Bicyclists. Since then, every May this event encourages folks to add biking to their commute and reduce gas emissions.

This year, the Office of Sustainability ran a Bike Challenge to encourage BC students, staff, and faculty to bike more. Participants input their bike milage, and the top three riders won prizes! This year Jonny Diehl won, with 143.3 miles.

Along with the Bike Challenge, our office hosted a bike maintenance workshop with Cascade Bike Club where riders could expand their knowledge of maintenance, repair, and safe riding. We also hosted a Celebration Station to give away useful biking accessories to campus and encourage biking throughout the year!

At the end of the school year many students pack up and moved out of housing. Sometimes residents can't take everything with them and so for those items left behind, we run a donation program!

The program encourages residents to not trash their unwanted items, but instead give them a second life and reduce what gets sent to the landfill, while helping others in need.

## **Housing Energy Competition**

From May 31st to June 14th, the Office of Sustainability ran the second Student Housing Electricity Conservation Competition to help educate, engage, and improve utility consumption at Student Housing Wing communities within housing competed against one another to see who could reduce their electricity consumption the most over a 2-week period. 2West was the winner for having the largest percent reduction in energy usage.
