Transfer Admission Agreement (TAA) with Bellevue Community College

Admission Requirements for upper-division (90 quarter or more transferable units)

1. Completion of 90 transferable units which include the 4 Basic Subject Requirements: Written/Oral Communication, Critical Thinking and Quantitative Reasoning with at least a "C" grade in each course.
2. TOEFL & IELTS are waived with completion of 90 transferable units and the 4 Basic Subject Requirements or completion of English &101 and English 201 or 271 by spring or fall term prior to transfer (see area E).
3. Minimum transferable GPA of 2.40. It is recommended that you complete as many General Education courses in areas A, B, C, D and E as possible. Completion of these areas is not required to transfer.
4. Apply on time for Fall Admission: Apply between October 1 – May 1 (Nov. 30 for impacted/high demand)
5. Apply on time for Spring Admission: Apply between August 1 – September 30
6. The following Impacted/high demand majors have an application deadline of November 30 and may have additional admission requirements such as second year English Writing Composition: Apparel Design and Merchandising, Broadcasting and Radio/TV, Child & Adolescent Development, Cinema, Design & Industry, Dietetics, Environmental Studies, Health Education, Interior Design, Journalism, Kinesiology, Nursing, Psychology and Social Work. Transfer credit for courses completed in Areas A, B, C, D & E will be determined upon final evaluation of all official transcripts and test scores submitted to the International Undergraduate Admission Office at SF State. Students should meet with their counselor regarding the TAA early in the application process. Lower-division transfer students are eligible to apply without any course requirements, but must have a GPA of 2.4, submit official high school transcripts with proof of graduation, college transcripts, proof of English Language Proficiency (TOEFL/IELTS) and apply on time.

Recommended Distribution of General Education Courses: (40 - 45 quarter credits) in areas A, B, and C.

A) Sciences (10 - 11 quarter credits): Complete one course in each category plus one lab course.

Additional Courses	One of the courses selected must include a Lab associated with the lecture.		

B) Humanities and Creative Arts (15 quarter credits): Complete 3 courses, at least two with a different prefix.

Note: English and Philosophy courses listed under "Basic Requirements" cannot be used in this section.

C) Behavioral and Social Sciences (15 quarter credits): Complete 3 courses at least two with a different prefix.

Behavioral Sciences (must be a 5 credit course)	SOCIAL & BEHAVIORAL STUDIES, POLITICS SCIENCE, PSYCHOLOGY, SOCIOLOGY, SOCIAL SCIENCE, ECONOMICS,		

D) US History and Government (10 quarter credits)

Requirement	Courses at Bellevue		
U.S. History	HIST& 146 , 147 or 148 (One course = US History; HIST& 146 and 147 = US History and US Government)		
U.S. Government	POLS& 202 or HIST& 146 and 147 (see above) (A California Government course and/or examination required at SF State for graduation)		

E) Additional Courses (20-30 quarter credits)

Requirement	Courses at Bellevue		
Impacted Majors may be required to complete 2 nd year English Writing Composition	ENGL 201, 271 (completion of 2 nd year English Writing Composition with C grade or better will waive TOEFL/IELTS requirement for lower division transfer students with less than 90 quarter units)		
Elective Courses (must be a 5 credit course)	Choose college level courses specific to the area of education you may wish to pursue such as accounting, management, computers, or additional courses in science, math, language etc.
