PROGRAM INCLUDES

- Student housing in single occupancy studios in an apartment. Centrally-located within Berlin, studios include a shared kitchenette and living space, linen/towels, and WiFi.
- An orientation program on arrival, consisting of an orientation meeting with AIFS staff, information on safety and security, a local area walking tour, and a welcome dinner.
- Travel pass for unlimited use of the buses, trams, S-Bahn, and U-Bahn trains in transit zones A and B.
- Sightseeing tour of Berlin by private bus with the services of a professional, English-speaking guide.
- German Life and Culture course taught by a local guest lecturer, focusing on historical, political, economic, and cultural aspects of Berlin and Germany.
- Weekly program of free and subsidized cultural activities such as a boat cruise, opera tickets, sporting events, museum visits, street art workshops, and walking tours.
- Guided tour of the Reichstag.
- Full-day excursion to Potsdam including sightseeing tour by private bus, visits Cecilienhof Palace and Sanssouci Palace, with the services of professional, English-speaking guides.
- Half-day excursion to the Memorial and Museum of Sachsenhausen, including entrance fee and audio guides.
- Access to the AIFS Student Center and the services of AIFS support staff for information, personal advising, and 24-hour emergency contact service.
- Medical Insurance Policy.

OPTIONAL BALTIC SEA EXCURSION FEES

Optional three-day, two-night excursion to the Baltic Sea including round-trip transportation and accommodation in multi-bedded rooms in a centrally located hostel in Ruegen or Stralsund with daily breakfast and dinner, sightseeing walking tours and museum admissions, and the services of an AIFS representative for \$395 (a minimum of 10 must enroll for the trip to run)

Based on an enrollment of 15 or more participants, the fee per person is \$7,795. This fee excludes airfare, optional medical insurance upgrade, passport or visa fees, meals other than those listed, personal expenses, any WCCCSA tuition or administrative fees, textbooks, additional field trips or excursions required by the WCCCSA faculty and anything not specified.

These fees are guaranteed not to change as a result of fluctuations in the \$ exchange rate.

OPTIONAL TRANSPORTATION PACKAGE

An optional Transportation Package is available, consisting of round-trip airfare between Seattle and Berlin, and round-trip transfers overseas between the airport in Berlin and student housing for an additional \$TBC. Mandatory additional U.S. government- and airline-imposed departure taxes, fees and fuel surcharges of \$TBC (subject to change) will be billed separately.

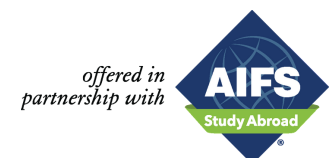
