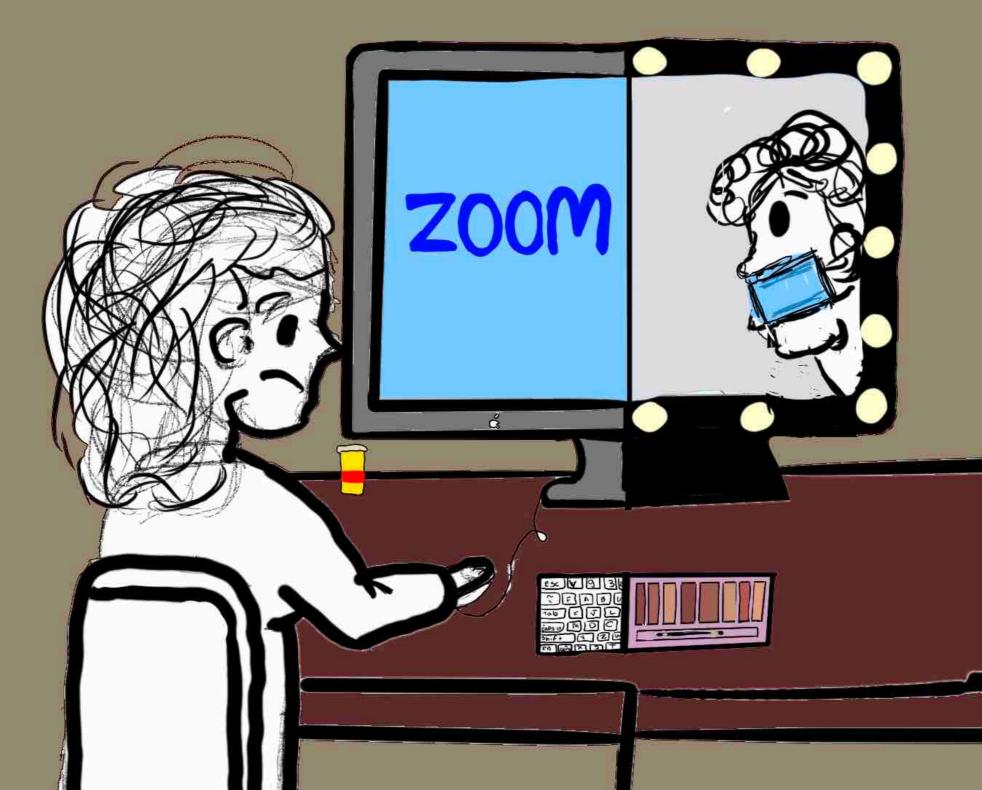
## **AMORA PITRE - Psychology of Pandemics**
