### **eLearning Summer Institute on August 15th-16th**

Instructional Designers will conduct interactive workshops and presentations on the following topics:

- A live demonstration of networked Vive VR headsets, use of **Virtual Reality** devices for live immersive communication.
- Applying Accessibility principles to Word documents and Canvas Pages
- Canvas Tools Active learning environment design using Canvas Syllabus, Gradebook, Groups
- UDL Incorporating Universal Design for Learning principles to an online environment
- Captioning Providing **Video Captions** with an Universal Design Approach using tools like: Screencast-o-matic, Snaglt and YouTube
