

Here are 5 jobs perfect for a Hospitality & Tourism graduate:

1) Chefs and Head Cooks

Chefs and head cooks oversee the daily food preparation at restaurants and other places where food is served. They direct kitchen staff and handle any food-related concerns. Students usually attend a culinary program with internship or apprenticeship program.

2) Food & Beverage Serving and Related Workers



Customer service, food preparation, and cleaning duties in restaurants, cafeterias, and other eating & drinking establishments are all part of serving the public. Usually workers work part-time, late evenings, and holidays.

3) Maids and Housekeeping Cleaners

Perform any combination of light cleaning duties to maintain private households or commercial establishments, like hotels and hospitals. People interested in hands-on problems and solutions with practical experience to disinfecting equipment and supplies.

4) Janitors and Cleaners, Except maids & housekeeping cleaners

Keep buildings in clean and orderly condition while performing heavy cleaning duties, such as cleaning floors, shampooing rugs, and performing routine maintenance activities, like empting trash. This is a hands-on problem and solutions career with practical customer service skills.

5) <u>Recreation Worker</u>

Design and lead fun activities to help people stay active and help improve fitness. Summer camps, nursing care facilities, fitness and recreational sports centers are all setting for arts and crafts, sports, dramatics, or games for people to participate in.
