## Bellevue College Housing COVID-19 Prevention and Impact Mitigation Plan

Drafted May 2020, Updated January 2021

Implementation: Spring 2020 and the 2020-2021 academic year (extended depending on COVID trends)

Objective: Outline a set of practices that, when combined, provide the highest level of safety and lowest risk for the spread and impact of COVID-19 within the Bellevue College Residence Hall.

Context: All institutions in the state of Washington are required to construct and share out plans for allowing residents onto campus that, to the greatest extent possible, reduces the likelihood of transmission of COVID-19.

Quarantine and Isolation Notes: No less than 4% of beds have been designated quarantine bed spaces; However, as per guidance from King County Public Health, all shared bedrooms have been converted to private bedrooms and all suites/apartments are considered "households," meaning that in the case of a positive or suspected case, suite/apartment mates will also be required to self-isolate. Thus, most students will be able to self-quarantine/isolate in their private bedrooms and use of the quarantine spaces are for emergencies only. Additionally, as all bathrooms are single-use and are shared by no more than one other student, use schedules are not mandated, but will be encouraged for students within their suites/apartments.
