COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES: This class continues the study of financial accounting. It is assumed that students have a base of understanding developed in Accounting 201, including an understanding of the accounting cycle. It is a required course in the business administration transfer program, useful to those who desire to major in accounting and those who do not.

CHAPTER ASSIGNMENTS, ATTENDANCE, PARTICIPATION: Chapter assignments, attendance, and participation are worth 1/7th of the course grade. Students are expected to complete these assignments prior to class. Reviewing the questions is probably the best way to prepare for chapter tests.

TESTS: Seven tests are scheduled including the final exam. Test dates are scheduled well ahead of time. If you know you are going to be absent on a test day, see me to make arrangements to take the test early. The instructor reserves the right to impose a penalty if a student takes a test late without prior permission or if a student is caught being dishonest on a test. Cell phones or other mobile devices are not allowed to be used on a test. Only a calculator can be used.

The four best test scores plus the final exam are worth a total of 500 points. 100 points are available for a comprehensive review project from Accounting 201 and 100 points are available for homework, attendance, participation and effort.
