Course Outcomes


This course is a survey of the political, social, and cultural history of the United States during the twentieth century. Upon completion of the course, students will have learned to analyze primary source documents; interrogate historical representations of gender, class, ethnicity, war, and society in film; and explain key concepts, events, and people in U.S. history. This course may count as a social science or humanities credit, but not both, at Bellevue College.

How Outcomes will be met

Course outcomes will be met through the following assessments: writing short essays about primary source documents that include memoirs, comics, and political statements; responding in essay form to historical films; and objective midterm and final exams.
