COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES: This class continues the study of financial accounting. It is assumed that students have a base of understanding developed in Accounting 201, including an understanding of the accounting cycle. It is a required course in the business administration transfer program, useful to those who desire to major in accounting and those who do not.

CHAPTER ASSIGNMENTS, ATTENDANCE, PARTICIPATION: Chapter assignments, attendance, and participation are worth 1/7<sup>th</sup> of the course grade. Students are expected to complete these assignments prior to class. Reviewing the questions is probably the best way to prepare for chapter tests. Students are encouraged to form study groups to work on chapter assignments. Teams are encouraged to compare the answers to the assignments before class in an attempt to come to an agreement on the correct answer.

TESTS: Seven tests are scheduled including the final exam. Test dates are scheduled well ahead of time. If you know you are going to be absent on a test day, see me to make arrangements to take the test early. The instructor reserves the right to impose a penalty if a student takes a test late without prior permission or if a student is caught being dishonest on a test. Cell phones or other mobile devices are not allowed to be used on a test. Only a calculator can be used.

GRADES: A total of 700 points is available. The five best test scores plus the final exam are worth a total of 600 points and 100 points are available for homework, attendance, participation, and effort. The grading scale is as follows:
