CLASS REQUIREMENTS:

This class has a collaborative learning option. Students are strongly encouraged to interview classmates and select a learning partner. Learning teams consist of 2 members and students may collaborate (share) on the project and turn in one copy per team. Teams are encouraged to study together and tutor each other on items not understood or missed. Lecture sections are designed to be interactive. Come to class having read the chapter and ask one question from the key concept list and contribute to the discussion when appropriate. Your question or contribution may be what you learn best. Side discussions are distracting and are not allowed.

Students are expected to attend class three times a week. If M W or F is a holiday take the responsibility to complete the weekly unit. Missing 20% of the class may result in automatic failure. You are not expected to notify the instructor when missing a class but you are expected to access missing information from your learning partner. Plan on arriving to class on time. Important instructional announcements/assignments will be given at the beginning of class. It is common to be late once or twice but don't plan on interrupting the class on a regular basis. I don't recommend sitting in the back row & don't be a stranger means if I don't recognize you that's not good.

In case of extended illness that limits your attendance I recommend to keep up with the syllabus schedule to the best of your ability. In other words read the text, complete the activities and prepare to do well on the final exam so that you may pass the course.

ASSIGNMENTS:

- 1. PROJECT: Project teams meet weekly in order to complete the project during the quarter as part of the hybrid weekly responsibility.
- 2 LAB ACTIVITIES: Complete a learning generalization for each lab consisting of 2 paragraphs. The first paragraph is a valid statement of what was learned and the second paragraph states the significant implications of learning or how can you apply this information. Credit for attending and participating only. (no make-up). Due 11/30.
- 3 STUDENT VIDEO TOOL KIT: View all video clips for each chapter and write a one paragraph response for one. Due Fridays
- 4 SEMINAR: Come to class Fridays to discuss either video assignment in the seminar.
