Course Outcomes


This course is a survey of the social history, political development, and cultural contributions of Latin America. Topics include ancient indigenous civilizations of Central and South America, Spanish and Portuguese colonization, revolutions for independence, and patterns of migration and globalization in the modern era. It may be used as either social science or humanities credit at Bellevue College.

How Outcomes will be met

Course outcomes will be met through the following assessments: 1 in-class essay about Aluisio Azevedo's *The Slum*, 2 at-home news reports, 7 online discussion posts about weekly readings, 7 in-class activities, and 1 in-class midterm and 1 in-class final exam.

2 "Latin America in the News" Reports = Due throughout the Quarter on Canvas = 100 points

Students will research a current event in Latin America by locating an online newspaper article, writing a report that is submitted on Canvas, and presenting their research findings to the class in a 15 minute presentation. The presentation will take place during class and the report will be submitted on Canvas by 11:59 pm that evening. Each report is worth 50 points.

Report # 2 = Due on Thursday 10/19 at 11:59 pm on Canvas, presentation in class that day

In-Class Essay = Thursday 11/16 = 50 points

In this Blue Book in-class essay exam, students will answer a prompt question about *The Slum* by Aluìsio Azevedo.

Extra Credit = Due Thursday 11/30

Up to 10 points of Extra Credit can be earned by writing a Reaction Paper after attending a campus lecture or scholarly event. This paper must be written in a narrative format and a minimum of 500 words in length.
