

MLA STYLE DOCUMENTATION

This handout gives some examples of how to document (or cite) information sources in bibliographies, works cited, or reference pages using Modern Language Association of America (MLA) style. For more detailed information, consult the **MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers**, 7th edition (call number REF LB 2369.G53 2009). A bibliography or works cited page appears at the end of a research paper. It informs the reader of the sources of quotes, facts and information used to formulate the opinions in your research paper. It is important to provide an accurate and complete bibliography to prevent plagiarism. Follow punctuation, capitalization, and italicizing as provided in the examples. Begin each entry even with the **left margin**. Subsequent lines for that entry are indented $\frac{1}{2}$ inch from the left margin.

- **Double-space** within and between all entries.
- Alphabetize entries by author; if no author is given, begin with title, ignoring the articles **a**, **an**, **the**.
- Do NOT number the entries.
- MLA requires that you state in your citation whether items are in print format or web (electronic) format.

NOTE: The examples in this handout are **NOT** properly double-spaced as MLA formatting requires.

<u>PERIODICAL ARTICLES</u> If you can't identify the author(s) of your periodical article, start the citation with the title of the article.
