English 092/101 Combined Class

The Accelerated Learning Program (ALP) allows students with ENGL 092 or ENGL 093 placement to enroll in an accelerated sequence of two five-credit classes to complete ENGL 092 or ENGL 093 and ENGL 101 in the same quarter. One class is a regular English 101 class, and the other is the smaller English 092 support class to work more deeply on the English 101 assignments by getting extra time and practice with the 101 instructor.

NOTE: Because English 092 is a prerequisite course for English 101, you must earn at least a C- (70%) in 092 in order to earn a C- or above in 101.

Assignments

The following are the kinds of assignments and approximate points totals for the quarter:

English 101 Essays (4 x 50 points each)	300
Reading and Writing Skills Exercises	120
Writing Lab Sessions (5 x 10 points each)	40
Participation (20 x 2 points each)	40
Total	500

Assignment Descriptions

- English 101 Essays are submitted and graded in Canvas in the English 101 class. Your instructor will manually add your essay scores to the English 092 class grades in Canvas.
- Participation is based on attendance in class. For each class you attend in its entirety, you earn 2 points. Late arrivals and early departures result in a 1-point deduction.
- Writing Lab Sessions require that you take one draft of each of the four essays for English 101 to the Writing Lab. For completion of the tutoring session according to the assignment directions in Canvas you will earn 10 points.
- Reading and Writing Skills Exercises include a variety of in-class and online practices in reading, grammar, punctuation, and more.
