STUDENT SUCCESS

With an annual enrollment of over 33,000, including 1,700 international students from 65 countries, BC is the third largest higher education institution in Washington.

BC graduates had the highest median wage (\$48,200) compared to all Washington colleges and universities for those earning a bachelor's degree in 2012.*

BC's Interior Design program was named among the top 20 programs in the world according to Webneel.com and top 10 in the nation by Study.com.

ACADEMIC INNOVATION

- BC offers research experiences for students in their first two years of undergraduate work that are not readily available even at the big four-year institutions.
- BC is a nationally recognized trailblazer in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) education.
- BC offers OLS (Occupational and Life Skills), a specialized associate degree program designed for adults with cognitive disabilities, the first of its kind in the nation.

Rising to the Challenge

In honor of BC's 50th anniversary, the BC Foundation's Board of Directors raised a special pool of funds in support of 50 new student scholarships. The "50 for the 50th" Scholarships would not have been possible without the support and driving force of donors Berthe and Stanley Habib. Berthe, a former Foundation Board member, has seen firsthand the need for financial support for BC students; for 28 years, she taught mathematics at BC.



"One of my beliefs is that Higher Education helps change one's life," explains Berthe. "What worries me most, however, is the high cost of college today. The only barrier for many prospective students to receiving a quality education at BC is the cost of tuition."

The Foundation reached out to 22 high schools in our district and asked for nominations of graduating seniors. We also invited each of the six BC divisions to nominate the students they felt were most deserving.

In addition to championing the "50 for the 50th" Scholarships, in 2005 Berthe and Stanley established the Habib STEM Scholarship which has helped numerous BC students throughout the years.

Broadcasting from BC: 91.3 KBCS

The BC Foundation is thrilled to partner with 91.3 KBCS. Broadcasting from the BC campus, KBCS is public radio providing Puget Sound with essential music and news. Listeners tune in to hear an unparalleled mix of new and classic worldbeat, folk, and jazz, in addition to unique and vital news and analysis.

Beginning on July 1, listeners heard a new vibe on weekdays when KBCS shifted and streamlined its schedule. Listeners now enjoy news and talk radio throughout the morning and a variety of music from noon through the evening.

KBCS leadership made the schedule change based on a two-year study of audience surveys and listening data. By bundling news and talk in the morning, and music from noon until 5 a.m., the station hopes to provide listeners with an even better listening experience.

DID YOU KNOW?

- 91.3 KBCS is the Eastside's only public radio station.
- Over 150 volunteer hosts, producers, and journalists deliver much of the music and news heard on the station.
- KBCS went live in February of 1973, with a tiny 10 watt transmitter and equipment donated by KING-FM.



Together Making a Difference

BC FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS

Nearly doubled the number of students awarded scholarships for the 2016-17 school year. 171 scholarships were awarded to 164 deserving students based on financial need, scholastic merit, or a combination of both.

Administered two grants through the Lockwood Faculty Excellence Awards, given to projects that exemplify academic innovation. Fernando Perez from the English department received a grant for expanding experiential learning opportunities through the BC Student Art Walk. The second grant was awarded to Kyle Barber of Marketing to support Bellevue College's national awardwinning student DECA program.

Recognized four faculty and staff members through the Margin of Excellence Awards for their remarkable commitment to students and the college. The Foundation recognized: Zak Yousuf from TRIO Student Services, Rusty Wire from Athletics, Frances Jurcik from Nursing, and Eric Nacke from ESL Developmental Education. Margin of Excellence Awards are a prestigious honor that includes an honorarium.

Awarded 13 Mini-Grants for creative, program-enhancing projects that would not be funded otherwise. Mini-Grant awards address diverse needs on campus, including new technology, such as Biology's purchase of two compound microscopes and two muscled arm models. This technology will better prepare students who pursue careers in health care or research. The Anthropology department was also awarded funds for a 3D printer, which will allow students, especially those with visual impairments, to produce low-cost models for use at home when enrolled in an online course.
