Infant 1 & 2 Teachers: Liliana, Mahboobeh, Tiffany & Rachel




Jade is so curious, investigating toys

T1 Teachers: Brian & Lisa Ann


Welcome back everyone as we get ready for fall quarter in T-1.

with words to help give them additional methods to communicate their needs with us. "More", "eat", and "please" are the most common signs the children understand first as they related to mealtimes.





What have the T3 Toddlers been learning?

During August, our toddlers had a chance to develop and improve new skills. We started practicing using scissors cutting the grass for our team art activity. They are developing fine motor skills by learning how to cut paper, and how to hold scissor. Children said "Open, cut and shut". It was challenging for them, but nevertheless, they showed curiosity and the ability to work hard. This demonstrated a positive approach to learning.

We have also been practicing our counting skills. Children use math skills in their daily routines and activities. Right now we are working on the ability to count verbally and to recognize numbers. During the circle time, our toddlers can stand in front of their friends, point to the numbers and name them.

August also brought great improvement in establishing and sustaining positive relationships. The children used successful strategies for entering groups. They loved to have pizza party, tea party, etc., playing

together for extended period of time sharing materials.



We continue to build on the old skill of clean up. They already know that "it is ok to make mess, but it is not ok to leave mess after you are done". So, it is a part of daily

routine to clean the area after themselves.

In September, during our outdoor activities, we will be working on following directions and our listening skills. Practicing holding safety rings while walking around our school helps our toddlers improve their safety skills in order of fire drill or field trip.

What have the Pre-K classes been learning?

August offered, us in Pre-K Two, a number of opportunities to explore the many activities that the Early Learning Center's Gross Motor Room, AKA "Preschool Five" has to offer.

The room was set up in "stations," each of which offered the children a different gross motor experience where they could experiment with various physical activities, among which were Turtle Shell Rockers, Sit and Spins, a climber, Sit Scooters, balls, and wedge gymnastic mats, the latter being by far the most popular of the centers.



Some of the amazing feats of physical prowess witnessed at the wedge mats were

summersaults, cartwheels, log rolls, and a variety of flips, both backward and forward!

In September, Pre-K Two will be welcoming new children into the room. One of the many ways to welcome Children into a new environment is to facilitate a positive social-emotional atmosphere.



We use games and activities such as Mister Clown, The Telephone Game, and Bug in a Rug to help children regulate and express their emotions appropriately.

We also use circle time books such as "Will I Have a Friend?" "Do You Want To Play?" "Horace and Morris but Mostly Dolores", among others to help both "old" and "new" children learn to build relationships with others, and interact in groups.
