



## How does LIP lead to college classes?

CEO/LIP is a full-time, 15 credit hour, pre-college level English language and academic skills program specifically designed for young adults.

- 1. Start LIP based on intake assessment placement
- 2. Advance levels based on successful completion of courses. Repeat levels if needed to master skills
- 3. Pass LIP level 6 & place into English 092/093 or English 101

(# of quarters depends on initial English level + student engagement, average time ~3-9 quarters) CEO 102 + ENGLISH CLASS+ Math class

CEO 103/104 + 2 MORE CLASSES

Students must complete an Associate Degree (2+ years of college-level courses) to also receive their HS Diploma



## Can I get the GED<sup>®</sup>?

LIP students can take GED<sup>®</sup> test preparation classes during the summer

Review and prepare for the four GED® tests: Reasoning through Language Arts Mathematical Reasoning Science / Social Studies

Determine readiness to take the GED<sup>®</sup> tests based on in-class practice tests. Develop test taking strategies and study skills.

From the school district where you reside\*

#### **Recommendation for Re-engagement**

Signed by counselor, teacher, school district, pastor, P.O. - NO PARENTS OR OTHER RELATIVES!

#### **Official Transcript from last High School Attended**

Homeschooled? Not necessary

#### **Choice Transfer Request**

Form required <u>only</u> if the last high school you attended is not in the school district where you currently live. Obtain from last high school.
