## Anyone aged 16-21

(age 16 on or before September 1st of current school year),





...dropped out of high school (GED® okay)

...is significantly behind in obtaining high school credit and/or recommended by case managers, Juvenile Justice System, or district personnel.



# How does LIP lead to college classes?

CEO/LIP is a full-time, 15 credit hour, pre-college level English language and academic skills program specifically designed for young adults.

- 1. Start LIP depending on intake assessment placement
- 2. Advance levels based on successful completion of courses. Repeat levels if needed to master skills
- 3. Pass LIP level 6 & place into English 092/093 or English 101

(# of quarters depends on initial English level + student engagement, average time ~3-9 quarters) CEO 102 + ENGLISH CLASS CEO
103/104 +

Students must complete an Associate Degree (2+ years of college-level courses) to also receive their HS Diploma



#### **Choice Transfer Request**

Form required <u>only</u> if the last high school you attended is not in the school district where you currently live. Obtain from last high school.


