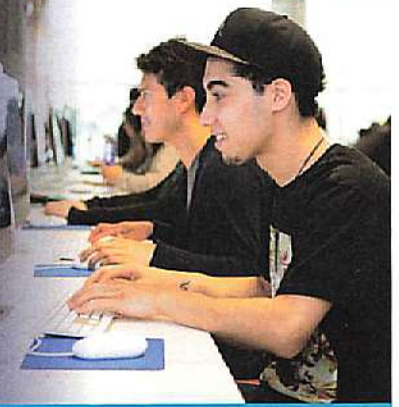

## Find the Support You Need to Complete High School on Your Terms

Thank you for your interest in Bellevue College! Our Center for High School Programs (CHSP) provides several options for students interested in completing their high school learning. The center is open to the general public, with a variety of quality high school equivalency courses. You can choose from many formats, and we can help you develop a plan based on your educational, career, and personal goals. We serve students aged 16 to 21 and take pride in providing a supportive and safe place for everyone.

Career Education Options (CEO)

### Language Integration Program (LIP)

**Learn English and Prepare for College Success!** LIP is part of the CEO program, providing services and support for English language learners who want to get a high school diploma and earn college credits. The LIP program enables students to learn academic English and work toward an AA degree, GED, high school diploma, and/or professional/technical certificate. Students also receive wraparound services and support to achieve their educational goals. Students attend LIP classes at the college. Classes are offered during the day and are capped at 18 students.

### LIP is for students learning English who are:

- 16–21 years old (must be 16 on or before September 1)
- Behind in credits for their age or grade level, or
- At risk of dropping out of high school

### LIP provides students with:

- Tuition, books, and school supplies
- Bus vouchers and ORCA cards
- Access and referral to all BC resources
- Individual case management
- College transition courses / academic advising

## Career Education Options (CEO)

CEO serves students between the ages of 16–21. CEO works with students at risk of dropping out of high school, as well as those who do not have enough credits to graduate. This program enables youth to work toward their high school diploma, GED, and/or other professional-technical and AA-degree credential(s). Participants receive wraparound services and support to help them succeed in their educational pursuits. We are committed to helping every student realize their unique potential, reconnecting them with their path toward success in both their education and career. Students attend CEO classes at the college. Earned CEO credits can be applied toward college credit.

## High School Completion Programs (HSC)

**We offer two options:**

- Our Youth High School Completion program for students between the ages of 16–21.  
This program offers coursework that meets the minimum credit requirement for a diploma in Washington State. In order to begin, eligible students must be 16 years old by September 1 of the current school year. The program allows students to continue in the program until completion or they reach 21 years of age, whichever comes first.
- Our High School+ (HS+) program offers a Washington State high school diploma for those who are 18 years or older. Students can combine previously earned high school credits, job training, and life experiences with our curriculum to finish their HS+ coursework. Students must be 18 years of age or older at the time of enrollment. With all classes taking place online, students are able to fit their HS+ learning around their schedule.

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
