Established in 1970, EPA's mission is to protect human health and the environment


EPA works to ensure Americans have clean air, water, and land

- Develop and enforce regulations
- Give grants
- Study environmental issues
- Sponsor partnerships (e.g., states, tribes, industry, nonprofits, academic institutions, etc)
- Teach people about the environment
- Publish information (e.g., research findings, environmental education materials, fact sheets, etc)



Working at EPA: Office Locations

- EPA Headquarters is in Washington DC
- EPA has 10 regional offices
- Region 10 is based in Seattle, WA and serves Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, Washington, and Federally Recognized Tribes
- Region 10 serves 271 Tribes, the most of any EPA regional office
- Region 10 staff work in Seattle, WA and 4 Operations Offices in Anchorage, AK; Boise, ID; Lacey, WA; and Portland, OR

Region 10 Outreach and Recruitment Goals For All Jobs:

- Recruit and retain a diverse workforce that is representative of the communities we serve in the Pacific Northwest.




Region 10 Student Intern Program Overview

Component	
Eligibility	Current students in college (including 4-year colleges/universities, community colleges, and junior colleges); professional, technical, vocational, and trade school; advanced degree programs; or other qualifying educational institution pursuing a qualifying degree or certificate. Must have completed two full academic years of post-high school study or an Associate's degree.
Duration	Agencies may hire Interns on a temporary basis for up to one year for an initial period, or for an indefinite period, to complete the educational requirement. Work is full or part-time.
Area of Focus	Internships may be located in Region 10's Air & Radiation, Enforcement & Compliance, Laboratory Services & Applied Science, Land, Chemicals, & Redevelopment, Regional Administrator, Superfund & Emergency Management, or Water Divisions. <u>Click here</u> to learn more about these programs. The positions are focused on implementing EPA laws, regulations, and policy to protect public health and the environment in the Pacific Northwest (e.g., water, air, land, environmental research, etc).
Conversion Process	Interns may be converted to a permanent position (or, in some limited circumstances, to a term position lasting 1-4 years) within 120 days of successful completion of the program. See job announcement for more information about program requirements.


Working at EPA: Region 10 Priorities
